Worth noting is that the Machias River Race, after a three-year hiatus (2022 was the most recent running), is returning to the Downriver Point Series in 2026, with father-son team JR and Ashton Mabee (who took 1st place overall in the 2022 race) intent upon revitalizing this exciting Down East paddling event by holding *two consecutive days* of races this year – and encouraging paddlers to race in different categories, though racing both days is not required to qualify for awards and prizes.

Flatwater Point Series Championship

The 2025 Flatwater Point Series included a total of 12 races:

The point system was based on 4 points for a first-place finish, 3 points for second-place, and 2 points for third-place. One point was given for completing the race though not finishing in the top 3 of a given class. The point system for 2026 will be similar to the point system used in 2025. President's Choice Award

Maine Paddle Race Miles for 2025

Once again there were a tremendous number of paddle race miles in Maine for 2025, which included 28 races starting with the St. George in March and ending with the Long Pond War Canoe Race in October. The following graphic speaks for itself, showing how many race miles (a total of 8,779 miles!) are paddled in a single Maine paddle racing season.

Various Maine paddlers represented Maine in various paddle races. Following are stories of three national races that Maine Paddlers participated in.

AuSable River Canoe Marathon

The AuSable River Canoe Marathon, is a non-stop 120-mile, C-2 (two-person) canoe race held annually on the last full weekend in July. The race starts at night with a thrilling LeMans-style running start to the river in Grayling, MI, and ends the next day on the shores of Lake Huron in Oscoda, MI. The Marathon is not a recreational canoe float. It is an ultra-competitive race that attracts professional paddlers from across the United States, Canada, and often teams from outside North America. In 2025 two boats represented Maine in the AuSable. The team of Aston Mabee and River Robertson returned to the race after good showing in the 2024 race. In 2025, Ashton and River improved their overall finish by more than 10 places, finishing 51st overall out of 103. Their time was 16 hours, 35 minutes, 36 seconds. The team of Rod McLain and Chip Loring finished the race in a time of 19 hours, 11 minutes, 17 seconds. They finished 103rd overall and were the last last team to make the cutoff time as an official finisher. Rod and Chip were the oldest team in the race. Congrats to the two boats representing Maine in the 2025 AuSable River Canoe Marathon,.

Chattajack 31

The Chattajack 31 is a paddle board, kayak, and canoe race that winds 31 miles through the Tennessee Rive Gorge starting from downtown Chattanooga, Tennessee. The race celebrates the effort a paddle athlete makes in the pursuit of distance endurance. Two boats from Maine participated in the 2025 Chattajack 31. Chip Loring and Dan Baumert paddled a C2 outrigger canoe finishing 15th out of 16 in their class with a total for a time of 5 hours, 49 minutes, 32 seconds. The team of “Dan B and Chippy” were the oldest C2 team in the race with a combined age 150 years! Rod McLain was the other Maine boat in the race paddling a C1 outrigger canoe in a time of 4 hours, 54 minutes, 9 seconds for a very respectable 16th place out of 66 total in his class. Chippy is already talking about going back again to the Chattajack 31.

Thursday Evening Orono Paddlers Race Events

The Thursday evening paddle events were again successful in 2025 in drawing members of the community to paddle on the Stillwater. Attendance varies quite a lot. On some Thursdays, only dedicated flatwater racers are in attendance, paddling their own boats. On other Thursdays solo and tandem boats are accompanied by 10-person war canoes. We remain very reliant on the generosity of the Penobscot River Keepers (Mike Maybury, in particular) for the use of their big boats, and on MaCKRO members who continue to volunteer to captain those boats (Peggy McKee, Terry Wescott, Chip Loring, Bucky Owen, and Eric Gallandt, among others). And we thank RW Estella for setting and collecting the turn buoys every week. Youth Outreach

The Orono High School Canoe Team is BACK for the 2026 racing season, with Jeff Owen as head coach working with any and all student-athletes who sign up. As in years past, Jeff will be looking to the racing community for veteran whitewater racers who are willing to volunteer to partner with the team's novice paddlers for the first three races (the St. George, Passy, and Souadabscook's short course). Orono Paddlers again hosted a youth paddling camp this August using the MaCKRO youth boats. It was a fun camp, especially with just six kids. We hope to continue with camps each year and market them more to rebuild the participation back to 12-15 each session.

In 2026 MaCKRO is looking to partner with any other groups or organizations to possibly sponsor some youth paddlers in any existing youth paddling development programs. Details are currently being worked out.

Tuesday Evening Group Training Paddles

For the past few years, there has been a group paddle around Orson Island on Tuesday evenings in June, July, and August. This is typically a good opportunity to do some friendly group flatwater race training, to work on paddling form, and to get tips and pointers from experienced racers. We anticipate this will continue in 2026. All types of boats and paddlers are welcome and encouraged to come. The group meets at 5:30 at the Old Town Boat Ramp on Fourth Street just above the Indian Island bridge. A notice will be sent out when the Tuesday group paddles start up again. Penobscot River Paddling Trail 2026 News



PRPT is pleased to announce several milestone achievements for 2026

- 1 An agreement was arranged with Penobscot Nation members Nick Bear and Gabe Paul to help PRPT achieve its longstanding goal of an educational initiative to highlight native history along the trail. We will unveil the first of these three installations at the Nibezun campsite in Passadumkeag on Sunday, July 12—at our annual meeting.
- 2 Please join us for the annual meeting at Nibezun on Sunday, July 12, which starts with an 8-mile paddle from Tannery Park in Howland to the PRPT Nibezun campsite. Please bring a picnic lunch. After lunch, some will paddle on to Old Town (+16 miles) with optional earlier take-outs at Greenbush Boat Launch (+7 miles) or Costigan Boat Launch (+11 miles).
- 3 Our long-sought-after northernmost campsite on the trail may have been found! At the Eastern Maine Sportsman's Show (3/20-3/22) PRPT hosted a booth. A couple visited our booth, and through the course of conversation they made an offer to PRPT to establish this campsite on their land. This site will (potentially) be located about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile downstream of the Mattaseunk dam in Mattawamkeag. This campsite will allow river paddlers a place to rest after an 8-mile paddle from Medway and a rigorous portage around the dam. An easy 7-mile paddle downstream to the 'Tannery Row' campsite in Winn follows.

Plan a short or long trip on the Penobscot River Paddling Trail this year, you won't be disappointed!
